

Heads of Households on Census Records from 1810 to 1880 with Special Relation to the Story of Pyrrhus Concer

Nathan Cooper – Enslaved Pyrrhus' maternal family and Pyrrhus was originally his indentured servant.

Olive Cooper – Nathan's wife who inherited his land and property after Nathan's death.

John Pelletreau – Possible man who purchased Pyrrhus from the Coopers.

Charles Pelletreau – Possible man who purchased Pyrrhus from the Coopers or inherited him from his father John along with his land. Raised Pyrrhus from about 5 years old to about 18 years old.

Gad Cooper/Williams – Pyrrhus' maternal grandfather who was originally a slave to Nathan Cooper.

Prince Williams – Gad's son and Pyrrhus' uncle. Was at one-point Pyrrhus' neighbor.

Shadrach Concer – Pyrrhus' biological father.

Nathan Cooper was the head of household and his wife was Olive Cooper. They had two sons Mercator and Gilbert. They also had a daughter Margaret, but her birthdate is unknown, so we are not certain if she is counted on here or not. Gad and Esther Williams were former slaves of the Coopers who had earned their freedom in 1803. However, their daughters Violet and Rachel remained slaves at this time. Their other daughter Millicent was born in 1801 and was an indentured servant to the Coopers having been born after the passing of the Act for the Gradual Emancipation of Slaves in the State of New York in 1799. But their son Prince was fully a freeman as he was born to free parents in 1806. The last slave is unknown.

John Pelletreau is the son of famous silversmith and patriot Elias Pelletreau and worked as a silversmith himself who is most likely the one listed as “engaged in manufactures”. His eldest sons Charles and Edwin were most likely the ones working in Agriculture and Commerce.

After the death of Nathan Cooper, Gad Williams became the head of his own household. It is unknown if they were still living on or near the Cooper property or somewhere else at this time. It is important to note that Gad's last name is listed here as Cooper. Violet gave birth to Pyrrhus in 1814 and her whereabouts at this time are unknown, however she did eventually move out of Southampton and may have been gone at this point. It is also curious that there are two girls under the age of 14 living in the home as their other daughters would have been older by this time unless Gad and Esther had more children.

With the death of Nathan Cooper on December 4, 1817 Olive became the head of the household in 1820. As you can see at this point none of the Williams family is listed as living here still. However with Gad being listed just before Olive, perhaps they were still on the property or at the very least neighbors but for the purposes of this census, recorded as their own household.

Charles Pelletreau inherited his father's home on South Main Street. We believe the other "free white male of 30 and under 40" was his younger brother Edwin but are not 100% sure. The two females in the home are not known, but Charles and Edwin never got married. But we do see a "free colored male of 10 and under 24" who we believe to be Pyrrhus Concer. This is based partly on the oral history that Pyrrhus ended up being sold to the Pelletreau family and the fact that this is the only individual who meets the general criteria to be Pyrrhus as provided by the census records at the time.

Neighboring Prince is his father Gad which can be deciphered by them being directly next to each other on the census record. Interestingly, we can infer that Pyrrhus was living here as he fits the description as being a "free colored male" between the ages of 24 and 35 at the time who was engaged in the business of "navigation of the ocean" as a whaler. One point of confusion lies in when exactly Pyrrhus began living with his wife who shares a first name with his aunt Rachel who both fit the description of a "free colored female" between the ages of 24 and 35 at the time.

In “Born Free” the author posits that Pyrrhus was living with his father in 1840 due to there being a “free colored male of 10 and under 24 years of age” in his home and also one person listed as “working in the navigation of canals, lakes, rivers”. However, Pyrrhus was 26 at the time and was working as a whaler at this time and would not have his ferry boat business until much later in life. It is understandable to think that mistakes were made when the census data was collected, and these two clues fit so close to Pyrrhus’ story. But when looking at the census record of Pyrrhus’ maternal grandfather Gad Cooper, it is clear that is more likely that Pyrrhus was living there in 1840.
